Barbara was on the organ bench during anthems each Sunday. *Barbara* was the one practicing on Friday afternoons when we heard music coming from the worship space.

During this pandemic time, we all have heard it said many times, "*things will be different*" when we get back together! On August 3, 2020, as staff members gather for their weekly zoom meeting, there will be faces missing from the screen. There will be names missing from the agenda. There will be voices missing from the discussion. WORSHIP PREVIEWS

AUGUST 9 – PENTECOST 9

In the first reading God invites all who are hungry or thirsty to receive food and drink without cost. Jesus feeds the hungry multitude and reveals the abundance of God. Readings: Isaiah 55:1-5, Psalm 145:8-9, 14-21, Romans 9:1-5, Matthew 14:13-21.

AUGUST 9 – PENTECOST 10

Elijah finds the presence of God not in earthquake, wind, or fire, but in the sound of sheer silence. When the disciples face a great storm on the sea, they cry out with fear. Jesus says: "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." Amid the storms of life, we gather to seek the calm presence of Christ that soothes our fears. God sends us forth to be a sign God's presence to others.

Readings: 1 Kings 19:9-18, Psalm 85:8-13, Romans 10:5-15, Matthew 14:22-33.

AUGUST 16 – PENTECOST 11

In Isaiah we hear that God's house shall be a house of prayer for all people and that God will gather the outcasts of Israel. The Canaanite woman in today's gospel is a Gentile, an outsider, who is unflinching in her request that Jesus heal her daughter. As Jesus commends her bold faith, how might our church extend its mission to those on the margins of society?

Readings: Isaiah 56:1, 6-8, Psalm 67, Romans 11:1-2a, 29-32, Matthew 15:[10-20] 21-28.

OUTSIDE WORSHIP AT UPPER CAMP, NAWAKWA AT 9:30 AM

The worship service will entail confession, reading, sermon, communion, and music, though there will be no congregational singing. <u>MASKS MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES</u>. *Please bring: your own chair or blanket, communion elements for your family (bread and wine/grape juice), bulletin and pen*. If you have coughs or fevers please stay at home. We ask that you not bring: tents/canopies, pets or picnic baskets. In case of inclement weather, the service will be cancelled. Bathrooms will not be available. Other details are: 14x14 foot squares will be marked out and your household will be assigned a square. Offering plates will not be passed; however, a bucket will be available for you to drop your offering in. Print the bulletin ahead of time. There will be a section for you to complete and turn in for attendance purposes (hence, bring your own pen, or complete it ahead of time). Parking attendants will guide you to your square. Seating people will take time, so arrive between 3:00-3:30 pm.

AUGUST 23 – PENTECOST 12

In Isaiah, the people are advised to look to their spiritual ancestors as the rock from which they were hewn. Jesus declares that the church will be built on the rock of Peter's bold confession of faith. God's word of reconciliation and God's mercy are keys to the church's mission. Paul urges us to not be conformed to this world but to offer our bodies as a living sacrifice, using our individual gifts to build up the body of Christ.

Readings: Isaiah 51:1-6, Psalm 138, Romans 12:1-8, Matthew 16:13-20.

AUGUST 30 – PENTECOST 13

The prophet Jeremiah speaks of the incurable wound of his suffering yet finds in God's words the delight of his heart. When Peter doesn't grasp Jesus' words about suffering, Jesus tells the disciples they will find their lives in losing them. Such sacrificial love is described by Paul when he urges us to associate with the lowly and not repay evil with evil. In worship we gather as a community that we might offer ourselves for the sake of our suffering world.

Readings: Jeremiah 15:15-21, Psalm 26:1-8, Romans 12:9-21, Matthew 16:21-28.
