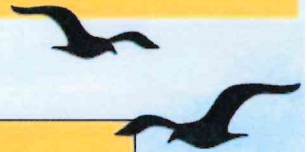


# Did you Know?

## Summer Heat Wave: Four Things Parents Should Always Keep in Mind

### 1. Keep kids out of hot cars

A child's body can heat up three to five times faster than an adult's body. When you combine this with the fact the temperature in your car can rise nearly 20 degrees in just 10 minutes, dangerous consequence can occur.

### 2. Enjoy the water safely

Never leave children alone in or near the water, even for a minute. Watch children with care in and around water, staying within touching distance of young children.

### 3. Protect your child from too much sun

Whenever your child is outside, use sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 to 30. Choose one that protects against UVA and UVB rays. Apply sunscreen 30 minutes before going outside. Reapply every two hours and after being in the water or sweating.

### 4. Prevent window falls

The summer weather has parents and caregivers opening windows and doors to try to get some circulation and relief from the heat resulting in children tragedies. They can be prevented with child safety devices and careful habits.
